



# Memorandum of Undertaking FNSW 2022 Competitions



**NOTE: Except where there is space to enter information, this document must not be edited in any way.**

## OVERVIEW

This Memorandum of Undertaking (MOU) defines a player and club's commitment to each other for the 2022 Football season. The MOU is provided to confirm registration prior to the opening of the Play Football registration system, **following which all registrations must be completed via the Play Football registration system.**

This process is intended to provide comfort to players and clubs alike that any commitment entered into prior to information being entered to the Play Football registration system will be honoured.

The MOU is valid for both amateur and professional player registrations. For the document to be valid for professional players, it must be supported by a duly signed professional player contract.

The MOU is for the benefit of the players and clubs, and both parties should retain a copy of the signed document. Football NSW will only require a copy should there be a dispute relating to player registration once the required information is entered into the Play Football registration system.

This MOU is valid from the date of signing until 31 January 2022 or when the player is registered to Play Football, whichever is earliest.

The Football NSW 2021 Competitions to which the MOU applies include:

- National Premier Leagues NSW Men's;
- Football NSW Leagues One Men's;
- Football NSW Leagues Two Men's;
- Football NSW Leagues Three Men's;
- Football NSW Boys' Youth League One;
- Football NSW Boys' Youth League Two;
- Football NSW Boys' Youth League Three;
- Association Youth League;
- National Premier Leagues NSW Women's;
- Football NSW Leagues Two Women's;
- Football NSW Girls' Youth League One;
- Football NSW Girls' Youth League Two;
- Girl's Skill Acquisition Program (Girl's SAP); and
- Skill Acquisition Program (SAP)

## PLAYER / CLUB COMMITMENT

In consideration of participating in the Football NSW 2022 Competitions, the undersigned club and/or player, as the case may be, hereby undertakes:

1. to comply with all obligations and requirements of the FA National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations and directives communicated by Football NSW in relation to the registration process for the 2022 Competitions;
2. in the case of a player, to register for the club in the league noted below for the 2022 Competitions;
3. in the case of a player, to complete the on-line Play Football registration process once accessible;
4. in the case of a Professional player, to abide by the terms and conditions of the [FA Professional Player Contract](#);



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5. in the case of a club, that the player's position within the team is confirmed as if the registration had been entered into Play Football at the time of signing this agreement;
  6. in the case of a player, that the player is not currently registered or under contract with another club, and commits to the club as if the registration had been entered into Play Football at the time of signing this agreement; and
  7. abide by the following:
    - a. Attend all scheduled training sessions throughout the 2021 season unless too sick to attend
    - b. Always act courteously and respect your fellow team players
    - c. Support the Club in the various social functions
    - d. Adhere to all FNSW & FFA Regulations and social media policies as applicable
    - e. Adhere to the Camden Tiger FC Player's, Parent and Spectator Code of Conduct
    - f. Consent to photo's to be published on the Camden Tigers FC media/websites
    - g. Accept this offer lapses if payments are not received by due dates and player may be de-registered and placed on the FNSW un-financial list.
      - 50% Deposit of the registration fee will be paid by EFT before November 24, 2021
      - Full payment of the registration fee will be paid by EFT before January 28, 2022

- h. Should a player leave the Club for whatever reason, with effect from 1 February 2022
    - U13, U14, U15, U16, U17 and U18 - the FFA & FNSW registration fee component along with a \$350.00 Club administration fee /uniform fee will not be refunded. Game day playing Jerseys (Home and Alternate) must be returned and remain property of the club
    - U20 – forgo all registration fee and must return Game day playing Jerseys
    - 1st Grade - must return all clothing/equipment that has been supplied
  - i. Support the club and play up grades when requested
  - j. Accept the Coach and the Technical Director decisions
  - k. Assist with Canteen Duty if and when required
  - l. Do not train or trial for another club without Camden Tigers FC written permission
8. **That all information provided within this MOU is true and correct.**



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## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PLAYERS THAT ARE PAID BY THE CLUB

Players who participate for Clubs who play in the NPL NSW Men's, Football NSW Leagues One Men's, Football NSW Leagues Two Men's, NPL NSW Women's and Football NSW Leagues One Women's Competitions will be either Amateur or Professional Players as prescribed in the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations (NRSTR)

A club may pay or reimburse a player any expenses incurred by that player without affecting his or her status as an Amateur, including but not limited to travel, kit, equipment or insurance premiums.

However, if a player is paid or reimbursed more than **\$110 a week** by a club, the player is deemed to be a Professional and the player and the club must enter into the [FA Professional Player Contract](#) and the club must lodge a copy of that signed contract with Football NSW along with a completed [Professional Player Registration Form](#), unless the club is able to satisfy Football NSW that the amount paid accurately reflects the expenses incurred by that player.

If a club believes that the amount paid to the player accurately reflects the expenses incurred by that player and that the player is therefore entitled to be registered as an Amateur rather than as a Professional, the club must apply in writing to Football NSW for approval to register the player as an Amateur prior to accepting the player's registration on Play Football.

If a player who is paid or reimbursed more than \$110 a week by a club is registered as an Amateur and approval to do so has not been sought (or has been sought but refused) by Football NSW, the player and the club are liable for heavy sanctions. Those sanctions may include, but are not limited to, fines and the loss of competition points for clubs and periods of suspension for players.

**NOTE: Where a club is paying players any amount of money, the club and the player should obtain independent tax advice to ensure they are meeting their tax obligations and superannuation obligations (in the case of clubs).**
